Re: **Traffic Calming Installation**


The City of Saskatoon (City) is undertaking a pilot project to install temporary traffic calming devices in neighbourhoods that do not meet the current criteria for permanent traffic calming installations. This pilot is being initiated at the direction of City Council and is in response to inquiries from residents to investigate new methods of reducing neighbourhood traffic speeds.

The traffic calming device that has been selected for this pilot project is a rubber speed hump. Four locations have been approved for the pilot including the **stretch of Vic Boulevard between Assaly Street and Hunter Road**. A rubber speed hump will be temporarily installed on Vic Boulevard near Howard Harding Park and will remain in place until the fall so that City traffic engineers can monitor its effectiveness.

When the effectiveness of this tool is measured, the City will consider community feedback. A survey will be circulated in late summer to collect this feedback.
